

Purpose

Kulevi Oil Terminal and Port is designated for transshipment and storage of oil and oil products with its further loading to vessels.



The Terminal from the respect of it's:

Functionality - is a transshipment point;

Transport measures – refers to railway and marine;

Annual freight turnover – **1st Class Terminal**;

Overall storage capacity – **1st Class Warehouse**

Overall storage capacity of Tank Park is 320 000 m3 with the prospect of increase up to 380 000 m3.

For loading operations there are two berths for receiving tankers with tonnage up to 100 000 tons. Loading performance is from 1000 to 8000 m3/h. The Terminal has its own Railway station, where 180 oil tank cars can be placed for discharging. The trestles make possible the simultaneous discharge of 168 oil tank cars.

Achievements:

In November, 2008 Kulevi Oil Terminal and Port **was certified** by “Moody International” in **ISO 9001** (Quality Management System), **ISO 14001** (Environmental Management System) and **OHSAS 18001** (Occupational Health and Safety Management System). In spite of being functioned only for six months, the Terminal achieved this goal by successful team work of its qualified personnel.



On the 22nd of January, 2009 at Rewarding Ceremony of “Union of Oil Products’ Producers, Importers & Consumers” the Black Sea Terminal Ltd. was honoured with Diploma of **“Oil & Oil Products’ Terminal with the Best Infrastructure”**.



Projects:

Reconstruction of 6 railway lines

Kulevi Oil Terminal undertook an obligation to reconstruct six railway lines at Samtredia station in the west of Georgia. The reconstructed railway lines are 5 km long. It's also being reconstructed Chaladidi station with adding 2 new lines.

As expected all these works will allow increasing the annual turnover of oil transshipment through the Terminal.



Financing ecological projects

In 2008 there was founded the **“Fund of Kolkheti protected territories development”**. It is invested by the Terminal and is to carry out compensation measures for requirements of Ramsar Convention on Wetlands.
